Thursday Night, April 25: Meds are due THIS night in the New Gym with the accompanying Self Medication / Medication Form. Prescription meds should be in the original container (whenever possible) and only include the amount necessary for the trip. Over-the-counter meds should be in sealed original containers. Meds include vitamins, supplements, etc. - anything you eat, drink, swallow, or sniff. Topical ointments do not need to be submitted. All meds must be labeled with name & bus number, and then all containers should be put in one clear ziplock bag, and again labeled with name and bus number. **ALL STUDENTS** must return the Medication/Self Medication Form tonight.

6:30 AM: Attendance in the Main Gym bleachers and then final search of pockets, shoes, and purses (small things that might be brought Friday morning) by staff and some HS administrators (like a dance search). Following that - Students carry luggage/equipment and go straight from the main gym to the motor coaches. Students are not permitted back in the building. Estimated Departure: 7:30 AM Medicines will be returned to students after departure. Students can self-administer during the trip. Students who are not self-administering medicines will need to see Dr. Suyama each morning and night at the hotel.

CHECK LIST

• Full Uniform

- 1. Black Marching shoes (in suitcase)
- 2. Long Black Socks (in suitcase)
- 3. Black Gloves (in garment bag)
- 4. Gauntlets (in garment bag)
- 5. Uniform Pants (in garment bag)
- 6. Uniform Jacket (in garment bag)
- 7. Uniform Hat in hatbox (NOT in garment bag)
- 8. This year's Blue Band Shirt to be worn Sunday morning (in suitcase)
- 9. NO EAR RINGS (OR FACE RINGS) DURING THE PARADE PERFORMANCE!
- 10. HAIR MUST BE UP AND UNDER HAT (neatly)! Bring hair ties if necessary.
- 11. Full Dance/Guard Uniform (double check with Ms. Nowak or Mrs. Bacher) (in garment bag)
- Instrument!! Including sticks, carriers, mouthpieces, reeds, ligatures, valve oil, etc!!
- Band Trip T-Shirt (in suitcase).
 - 1. The charcoal Band Trip Shirt will be worn Saturday at Kings Island.

Bus Luggage

- 1. Each student is permitted to bring only ONE small carry-on bag on the bus (not to exceed bookbag size). A purse may be taken on the bus in addition to the carry-on.
- 2. Each student is permitted to put only ONE piece of luggage under the bus. We really don't have room for you to over pack. Please be reasonable when packing!
- 3. Every student is responsible for getting their own luggage, instrument, garment bag, and hat box to the bus.
- 4. Flutes and clarinets are to be stored in your suitcases!!!!
- 5. EVERY instrument case MUST be labeled with the student's name & bus #!

Medicine

- 1. All medications must be in the original pharmacy container, labeled with the student's name, bus number, medication name, and dosage. Please put all the labeled containers in one clear ziplock bag and then label the bag with your name and bus number. Students can maintain and self-administer their own medications OR have our medical volunteer keep the meds (circle "yes" or "no" on the Self-Medication Form to select your preference) Only send the amount of medicine you need for the 4 days of the trip. For over-the-counter medicine, it needs to be in the original sealed container we recommend using the small travel size options. Medicines (and the Self-Medication/Medication Form) all get submitted to the MAIN GYM Thursday evening, April 25, during luggage/uniform drop-off. The school nurse (Mrs. Nelson) and Dr. Suyama (HBA medical volunteer) will be at the luggage/medicine drop-off night to check to see that the medical form matches the submitted medicine. The medicine will be returned to the students immediately after the buses have departed the high school.
- 2. "Medicine" includes prescriptions, over-the-counter meds, vitamins, supplements, etc. anything you eat, drink, swallow, or sniff. You do not need to submit topical treatment items like Neosporin.

Emergency Preparedness Information

- 1. <u>Hotel Fire Alarms:</u> Students are to report directly to their bus in the parking lot for attendance and to wait for the hotel to issue clearance on re-entering the building. Students are NOT permitted to ignore the fire alarm!!
- 2. <u>Bus breaks down:</u> From our travel director: "Fortunately, a bus breakdown is something I don't experience frequently. Safety of our passengers is our number one priority. We do not like buses sitting on the side of the highway. We would fill in unoccupied seats in other buses and proceed to the next rest area or interstate exit. If necessary, we would set up a shuttle to get passengers off the disabled bus. If there is a meal involved, we would proceed to the restaurant. Depending on the mechanical issue, and location of breakdown, we would call a road side service. Depending on circumstances and itinerary, we have a network of bus companies to call to send a motor coach to replace the one that is having mechanical issues."
- 3. A student becomes lost or injured: Students will have the cell numbers for all seven booster officers accompanying the band on the trip. Students should call a chaperone immediately. If we determine a student to be missing, we would immediately call the student while we re-trace our route from the last moment we had the student. We would also call the local police and parents immediately. For injuries, we would do our best to establish contact with the parents immediately. If parent contact is not possible, we will follow the medical form and make the best decisions we can on behalf of the student.
- 4. **Groups of 3 or more:** Students are required to stay in groups of at least THREE! We will "adopt" couples and singles to give them the special privilege of hanging out with staff until they can join a larger group. Students will have immense free time all day Saturday at Kings Island.
- 5. Threatening weather: We will use the BAND App to communicate instructions to all of the students that make sense for where we are. Please make sure to get the BAND App (search for: Hampton Talbot Marching Band). The answer to the login question is, "minus 1." Additionally, please also sign up for REMIND texts: REMIND app: Text: hamptonhsm TO 81010 to join. A Remind text will be sent to alert students to check their BAND app.

Hotel Rules

- 1. Per the behavior contract, male students are not permitted on female floors and female students are not permitted on male floors. Romantic couples are not permitted in each others' rooms.
- 2. Students must be in their rooms by curfew and not leave their rooms following curfew. Students caught out of their rooms after curfew will be disciplined during the next few activities of the trip.
- 3. Students are not permitted to run and scream throughout the hotel lobby areas, hallways, and rooms.
- 4. Students must treat their room with respect. Food is to be eaten, not thrown across the rooms! You are not a member of the Pittsburgh Pirates and don't need to use pizza for batting practice in your room!
- 5. Students must meet school dress code expectations when they are out of their rooms.
- 6. Students will be required to complete a "Hotel Damage Report" upon arrival. Students will be charged for additional damage noticed upon check out not documented upon arrival.
- 7. Students you are smart if you don't want to be caught doing something then don't do it in the first place. You know what is appropriate and not appropriate.
- Students SHOULD HAVE A CELL PHONE WHILE ON THE TRIP! If your child does not have a cell phone, please highly consider purchasing a cheap temporary cell phone from Wal-Mart and let us know what the number is. If your child finds themself in a threatening situation while on the trip, the cell phone may be their only way to safety.

Miscellaneous

1. Student drivers who have a valid HHS parking pass are permitted to leave vehicles in student designated spaces. It is recommended for these students to leave vehicles in the student spaces near

the pool entrance / Blue Field as this will help with Friday morning as well as being closer to the band room after the trip.

- 2. There is no room for students to over pack. Pack within reason!
- 3. Coolers ARE NOT permitted on the bus!
- 4. Do not store shoes in the garment bags. The added weight is not good for the garment bag. In addition, the bags will not lay well under the bus if shoes are in them.
- 5. <u>Any music listened to on the bus must be listened to with headphones/earpods, etc.</u>!!!! (Just because 3 students might want to listen to the same music doesn't mean the entire bus wants to listen to that music)
- 6. Every marching student MUST have clean black gloves!!! We will have extra clean black gloves at Luggage- Check for you to purchase if you need to update your gloves.
- 7. Additional spending money could be required for souvenirs (optional) or extra food (optional). Please know, though, that students can come on the trip without any money. The trip fee was all-inclusive; every activity and meal has already been purchased.
- 8. The indoor water park is open until 8PM each night.
- 8. Motor coach is equipped with a DVD player. Bring "G" and "PG" movies. Chaperone discretion will be used for "PG-13" movies. Students should not argue with a chaperone regarding this! Movies rated "R" or worse are not permitted.
- 12. The rest room on the motor coach is for <u>emergency purposes</u> only. Please think ahead and use public

restrooms before getting on the bus.

- 13. The telephones (long distance access) and pay per view television will be turned off in your hotel room. Students are responsible for any incidental room charges.
- 14. Check <u>www.weather.com</u> prior to departure for current weather conditions. Predicted high = 74degrees.
- 15. Students are not permitted to go off on their own. Free time provides an opportunity for independent activities and pursuit of personal interest; however, students must engage in these activities in groups of

three or more. Hang out in groups; it's safer, will keep you out of trouble, and it's our rule[©]! If we notice students in groups of 2 or solo, they will get the special experience of hanging out with staff until they can find more students to join.

- 16. There may be times when we have to deviate from the printed itinerary—please be flexible.
- 17. Dress Code: School dress code applies.
- 18. Other things you may want to bring: comfortable walking shoes for Saturday!! Sunglasses, alarm clock, cell phone (must bring if you own one)
- 19. Stay hydrated and eat/drink a good breakfast every morning!!!!
- 20. Make sure your cell number is accurate in your Charms profile. And make sure you get the BAND App from the App Store (again, search for Hampton Talbot Marching Band). The code is "minus 1." Please turn on notifications.
- 21. REMIND app: Text: hamptonhsm TO 81010 to join. A remind text will be sent to alert students to check their BAND app.

QUESTIONS SUBMITTED IN ADVANCE OF THE MEETING:

1. What kind of money should we send with our child?

Students will have opportunities to spend money at highway rest-stops, Great Wolf Lodge (arcade, candy shop, and other small attractions), Kings Island, the Churchill Downs Gift Shop. Having said that, the trip is all-inclusive for meals, activities, lodging and transportation. Students do not need to bring any money.

2. What is allowed on the bus?

A carry-on bag (backpack size). A purse (if necessary). Pillow. Blanket. Beverages and snacks are permitted on the bus SO LONG as they fit in the carry-on bag. Beverages must be in their original bottles with the <u>seal intact</u>. <u>No cans</u>. An empty refillable water bottle is okay but must begin the trip empty.

3. Can kids keep their laptops in their school locker?

Yes. Locking the locker would be a good idea!

4. When do carry-ons get dropped off?

Carry-on bags (backpack size) should be dropped off with luggage and instruments Thursday night. Students should really only bring a small pouch of toiletries Friday morning.

5. Is Review Stand seating available?

Yes, Review Stand seating is available. Tickets are available by calling (502) 584-FEST or by visiting our website at www.kdf.org. General Bleacher seating is sponsored by Churchill Down and is available free to the public

6. <u>Is anything cashless?</u>

Yes, Kings Island and Great Wolf Lodge are both cashless. From Great Wolf Lodge:
